BREVET D'ETAT DE CADRE SPORTIF (BECS)

OCTOBER 2015 - AUGUST 2016

Partie Générale et Partie Spécifique Niveau 2 (366 heures)

General Information

- 1- BECS means Brevet d'Etat de Cadre Sportif, a training course for coaches.
- 2- The main objective of the training course is to provide training facilities locally to sports cadres with a view to improve and enhance the coaching competence of such sports cadres.
- 3- The 2015 - 2016 partie générale course is the 19th batch since the programme started.
- 3.1. The 2015 – 2016, partie spécifique course is the 2nd batch since this programme started.
- 4- The training course is meant for all persons involved in sports coaching.
- 5- The course is run under the aegis of the Ministry of Youth and Sports in association with Sports Federations. A pool of resource persons/tutors is responsible to conduct the courses.
- 6- Components of the course:

The 366 hours course comprises two parts and 4 modules:-

- (i) The general part (240 hours) applies to all sports. Modules 1, 2 and 3 cover knowledge in Anatomy, Physiology and Methodology of coaching, Psychology and Psychopedagogy and history of sports and sports environment.
- (ii) The specific part Level 2 (126 hours). Module 4 covers, Techniques, Pedagogy, History, Assignment, Practical Sessions, Demonstration of Techniques in one Sport.

Candidates who successfully complete both parts (General Part and Specific Part Level II) together with the First Aid Course (which is 40 hours' duration) are awarded a Full BECS Certificate mentioning specialisation in one sport.

Specific Information (General Part/Specific Part)

The success of any training programme requires all participants and stakeholders to conform to certain rules.

It is therefore important to know and or to adhere to the following which may serve as a guide to both participants and tutors.

- 1 First of all, make sure you understand clearly:
 - the objectives of the training course;
 - the date it starts and ends;
 - the different modules and their contents;
 - the time table;
 - attendance requirements;
 - examinations procedures/evaluation methods;
 - reappearing for a module; and
 - conditions for the award of certificates.

2 Duration of the Course

The course is divided into 4 terms corresponding to each module as follows:-

- * 1st term (Module I) 08 October 2015 to 27 February 2016
- * 2nd term (Module II) 03 March 2016 to 27 May 2016
- * 3rd term (Module III) 04 June 2016 to 25 July 2016
- * 1st – 3rd term (Module IV) 02 October 2015 to 28 February 2016
03 March 2016 to 25 July 2016

3 Attendance Requirement

In order to be eligible to register and to take part in the examinations, the candidate must record at least 60% attendance for each module.

It is therefore important to register your attendance in the attendance sheet each time you attend the course.

4 Tuition and examinations fees, registration and dates for examinations

Exams fee Rs 1,250 per module (4 modules) = Rs 5,000

Tuition fee Rs 2,250 per module (4 modules) = Rs 10,000

5 Examination Authority and Official Languages of the Course

The Mauritius Examinations Syndicate (M.E.S.) is responsible for the organisation and control of the examinations (4 modules)

English and French are the two official languages for the course.

6 Conditions for the Award of a Certificate

Candidates must successfully complete the four modules with a minimum average of 50% marks in each module.

On having successfully completed the four modules, candidates are required to follow a First Aid Course of 40 hours duration.
